



INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

The Journal of Implant and Reconstructive Dentistry® (JIRD®) disseminates original articles about practical applications of dental implant and reconstructive therapies. Clinicians from around the globe read the journal both in print (English only) and online (multilingual versions). JIRD's Advisory Board, which includes some of the foremost leaders in the field of implant dentistry, helps to ensure that the journal content meets the highest professional standards. The editorial staff works closely with authors to ensure that all manuscripts conform to JIRD's editorial style.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

Original articles will be considered for publication only on the condition that they have not been published elsewhere in part or in whole and are not simultaneously under consideration elsewhere. Manuscripts will be edited, in consultation with the author, to fit the space available and ensure conciseness, clarity, and stylistic consistency.

Mailed submissions should include the following:

- two hard copies of the manuscript (printed double-spaced, on one side of the paper only, with one-inch margins),
- a CD copy of the manuscript,
- a complete set of images/illustrations (see below for details), and
- a Copyright Assignment Form (which will be sent to the author upon receipt of the manuscript).

Figures may also be attached to the e-mail in low resolution for initial review with the manuscript. Upon acceptance for publication, high resolution images 300 dpi may be posted to a secure ftp site (instructions will be provided) or may be sent separately on a CD to the editorial office. Manuscripts submitted via email *need not* also be sent via hard copy to the editorial office.

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Features

Feature articles should be 1,000-1,500 words, including references. (Figures and figure legends are not included in the word count.) Use of color illustrations is encouraged. We will work with you and our medical illustrators to create one or more illustrations to support the concepts discussed in the article. Authors should provide approximately one illustration, clinical slide, photograph, radiograph, or table for each 120 words (10-12 images per article).

Departments

Department articles should be 500 words, including tables and references. Four clinical images or illustrations are preferred.

Editorials

Editorials should be 250-300 words. No tables or figures are required.

Text

Pages should be numbered consecutively, starting with the cover page. Submissions should be in Microsoft Word format (.doc or .docx), double spaced, 12 point font. The cover page should include the title of the manuscript and the name, degree, current professional or academic affiliation (including city and state), and emphasis/specialty of private practice or research program for all authors. Also included should be the full postal address, telephone number, fax number, and e-mail address of the primary or contact author. Manuscripts can be organized in a manner that best fits the specific goals of the article, but should always include a brief abstract, an introductory section, the body of the article, and the clinical relevance (conclusion). Authors unfamiliar with the style of the journal may want to browse previous issues to learn by example.

Figures and Tables

For color photographs, digital images (300 dpi at 5" x 7") in jpeg or tiff format should be submitted. For original radiographs submitted, the name of the primary author should be written on the envelope. Charts, graphs, and drawn figures are also accepted and will be redesigned by JIRD's illustration staff if necessary.

Figure legends should be brief one- or two-line descriptions of each figure, included in the manuscript following the References. Legends should be numbered in the same numerical order as the figures.

Tables should also follow the references and should be numbered consecutively, according to citation in the text.

References

To be acceptable, a reference to print journals or books must include certain minimum data, in the following format:

Journals: Author(s). Article title. Journal name Year;volume(issue):inclusive page numbers.

Books: Author(s). Book Title. City, State of publication: Publisher, year.

Each article should contain a minimum of 10 and a maximum of 30 references, except in unusual circumstances. All listed references must be cited in the text. Citations in the body of the text should be made by numerical superscripts. The reference list (arranged not by alphabetical order but by order of citation in the text) should be listed on a separate page and should provide complete bibliographical information in the format exemplified below:
